Welcome to the student body of **Prisoners for Christ Bible Study Correspondence School**. By enrolling in our Correspondence School you are joining thousands of other students who are growing in their understanding of God's Word and how to personally apply these teachings to their lives. We look forward to assisting you in your study.

Because of our commitment to discipleship we have developed this Bible Correspondence School. The purpose of this course is three-fold. First, our desire is to provide you with a tool to help you grow in your knowledge and understanding of God's Word. An understanding of the Bible is the foundation upon which a person builds a successful and productive life. Second, through the understanding of God's Word and with the knowledge gained you are equipped to share this Good News with others. Each lesson is geared in such a way that you will be able to apply your new learning to your daily life. In this way you will be able to share your faith with confidence. Jesus commands us to "go and make disciples" in Matthew 28:18-20. This course will help you accomplish that.

A third reason to spend time completing these lessons is that you receive the benefit of having an appointed time to meet with the Lord each day and work on your lessons. It is a good practice to set aside a special time to meet with the Lord and put away the cares of the world for a few minutes each day. You will find that you will receive a new energy to face the challenges of each day.

We have divided our lessons into two different groups, the Basic Curriculum and the Advanced Curriculum. The Basic Curriculum lessons are structured to help you gain an understanding of who Jesus is, what He did for us and how we are to apply His teachings to our lives. It also helps you develop a pattern for your life based on the principles taught by Jesus. In the Advanced Curriculum you will be given the opportunity to study books of the New Testament more in depth and in this way give your faith more substance.

All you need to complete these lessons is a willing heart, a pencil and a Bible. If you do not have a Bible please contact your Chaplain as he or she will either have one or know of places to get one. Prisoners for Christ rely on donations to support this ministry. Because of budget constraints we do not have the means to send Bibles to students.

The following is very important information which we need in order to make sure that you get your lessons. **Please be sure that we have your name, ID/DOC number, institution and address and include your housing unit if it is required by your institution.** As long as we have a good address for you, either when you are incarcerated or after your release, we can send you lessons until you have completed the course. Also, please be very careful to print neatly so we don't make a mistake in addressing the envelope to mail back to you.

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INTRODUCTION:

What is the Bible? If I read it, what will it tell me? In the Bible we find out who God is and why He created us. It tells us how we can have a relationship with Him and how He wants us to live. The Bible has one central theme: the **Lord Jesus Christ**. The Bible has two sections: the Old Testament that speaks of the coming of Jesus Christ, and the New Testament that describes Jesus' arrival and His role in our lives today. The Bible is often called "**The Word of God**" or "**God's Word**" because it is God's living words to us.

Scripture Reading

2 Timothy 3:16-17 All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, 17 so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.

2 Peter 1:20-21 Above all, you must understand that no prophecy of Scripture came about by the prophet's own interpretation. 21 For prophecy never had its origin in the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.

Isaiah 40:8 The grass withers and the flowers fall, but the Word of our God stands forever."

Hebrews 4:12-13 For the Word of God is living and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart. 13 Nothing in all creation is hidden from God's sight. Everything is uncovered and laid bare before the eyes of him to whom we must give account.

2 Timothy 2:15 Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a workman who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the word of truth.

7. According to what you have learned so far, in your own words write a definition of the Bible. Imagine you are a child or a new Christian who knows nothing about the Bible.
